General Operations

Supervision of the pari-mutuel betting, and drug control services is provided by the Minister of Agriculture, The Hon. Gerry Ritz, MP. All pools are calculated and distributed in accordance with these Regulations. All tickets should be held until the result of the race is declared official. No minor shall purchase or cash a pari-mutuel ticket. Approximate odds represent the probable pay-out price of the win pool at the time they are posted and have no bearing on the pay-out price for any other pool. Where appropriate odds for any horse are posted as "1-9", the pay-out price based on a \$2 bet on the win pool may be as low as \$2.10. All tickets should be kept until the result of the race is declared official. No ruling made by the Judges or the Ontario Racing Commission with regard to distribution of purse money or the placing of horses in the order of finish, after the race has been declared official shall have any bearing on the pay-out prices or distribution of pari-mutuel pools. In the case of foreign separate pool betting, the rules of racing are those of the governing body that regulates the race.

Cancellation Policy

In the event that cancellation of races should result for any reason after four races have been run in any day's program, no refunds or issuance of rain checks will be made. If a cancellation results before the completion of four races, rain checks will be issued for admission and upon producing the day's Official Program at the program seller's booth, a next day's racing program will be exchanged. Under no circumstances will money be refunded.

Refunds

Subject to the provisions of the Federal Regulations, all monies bet in all pools on a race are refunded in the event that the race is canceled, declared off, declared no contest or postponed beyond the racing card for which it was scheduled. Subject to the Regulations, all monies bet on a horse are refunded if the horse is a late scratch or does not receive a fair start. Where a horse that is part of an entry is a late scratch and at least one horse of that entry or mutual field starts in the race, all tickets purchased on that entry or mutual field remain valid, and the purchase price of any such ticket shall not be refunded except when such entry involves the exactor or quinella feature in which case only those tickets coupling the two horses of the same entry shall be refunded.

Fair Start

The starter shall have control of the horses from the formation of the post parade until a start has been determined. For purpose of this rule, the determination of the start is when the horses have passed the starting point and have been released by the starter. 22.03 (h) There shall be no recall after the horses have been released by the starter. 22.03 (i) The starter shall endeavour to get all horses away in position and on gait. The starter shall only sound a recall for the following reasons: (i) A horse scores ahead of the starting gate; (ii) There is interference before the horses have reached the starting point; (iii) A horse has broken equipment, which the starter notices; (iv) A horse falls before the starting point; (v) A horse coming to the starting gate in the wrong position; (vi) A malfunction of the starting gate or in the interests of safety. 22.03 (l) If a horse has not reached the Fair Start Pole when the horses are released at the starting point by the starter, the judges shall cause the "inquiry" sign to be displayed immediately.

Breaking Rule

When a horse breaks from its gait in a race the driver shall: (a) take the horse to the outside of other horses where clearance exists and; (b) properly attempt to pull the horse to its gait; (c) lose ground while on the break. If there has been no violation of (a), (b) or (c) above, the horse shall not be set back unless a contending horse on its gait is lapped on the hind quarter of the breaking horse at the finish, however, notwithstanding the foregoing, if interference caused by another driver(s) or horse(s) has caused the horse to be on a break at the finish, the judges may, in their discretion determine not to set the horse back even if a contending horse on its gait is lapped on the hind quarter of the breaking horse at the finish. The judges may set any horse back one or more places if, in their judgment, any of the above violations have been committed, or if the horse goes on an extended break, and the driver may be penalized.

Entry or Field in an Exactor

Exactor pools on races that have an entry (1 and 1A and/or 2 and 2B) or mutual field (14f, 15f...) will not offer a wager combining both halves of the same betting interest (ie. 1-1, 2-2, field-field). If the same betting interest finishes first and second, the exactor payout will be on those horses finishing first and third.

Daily Double & Late Double Betting

Where the daily double feature is operated, the daily double is a betting transaction in which the purchaser of a ticket undertakes to select the winners of each of the two races specified for the daily double and that if the purchaser of a daily double ticket fails to pick the winner of the first half of the daily double his bet is void and that all tickets in the second half of the daily double not coupled with the declared official winner of the first half of the daily double are void no matter what circumstances might affect the programmed running of the second half of the daily double. The daily double is operated as an entirely separate pool and is not affected by wagering in other pools operated on the daily double races. Should a horse or horses (not coupled with a starter) be excused from starting in the second race of the daily double after the first race of the daily double has been declared official, holders of all daily double tickets on such horses, coupled with the winner of the daily double race, shall participate in the Consolation Double pool.

Exactor Betting

Where the exactor feature is operated, the exactor is a betting transaction in which the purchaser of a ticket undertakes to select the first two horses to finish, in the exact order of finish, in the race on which the feature is operated.

Triactor Betting

A triactor bet is a betting transaction in which the purchaser of a ticket undertakes to select the first three horses representing different betting interests to finish, in the exact official order of finish, in the race on which the feature is operated.

Superfecta Betting

A superfecta bet is a betting transaction in which the purchaser of a ticket undertakes to select the first four horses representing different betting interests to finish, in the exact official order of finish, in the race on which the feature is operated.

Pick-3 or Win-4 Betting

The Pick-3 and Win-4 features are betting transactions in which the purchaser of a ticket undertakes to select the winners of three or four consecutive races on which the Pick-3 or Win-4 is scheduled to be run. The winning combination of horses constituting a winning ticket shall be those horses that finish first, in the official order of finish in each leg or feature. Where no tickets have been sold coupling horses finishing first in the official order of finish of each leg of the pool, winning tickets shall be determined in the following sequence: Pick-3: (a) the winner of two legs; (b) one winner of one leg; (c) the three horses finishing second; (d) sequentially thereafter. Win-4: (a) the winner of three legs; (b) the winner of two legs; (c) one winner of one leg; (d) the four horses finishing second; (e) sequentially thereafter. Pick-3 or Win-4 Scratches: Rule 11 (1). In the event a Pick-3 or Win-4 feature ticket designates as a selection in any one or more of the races comprising the Pick-3 or Win-4, a horse which is scratched, excused or determined by the Stewards/Judges to be a non-starter in the race, the favorite, as evidenced by the amount wagered in the win pool at the time of the start of the race in which the scratch(s) occurred, will be substituted for the non-starting selection for all purposes. (2) In the event that the money bet in the win pool for (2) two or more favorites is identical, the selection identified in the lowest program number shall be substituted for the non-starting selection.

Pari-Mutuel Deductions

In Win, Place, Show, Daily/Late Double, Exactor and Quinella 18% is retained by the Association; Pick pools and Superfecta pools 21.3% is retained by the Association, 2.0% Provincial Levy, 0.5% by the Ontario Government and 0.8% by the Federal Government.

In Triactor pools 21.3% is retained by the Association, 4.0% Provincial Levy, 0.5% by the Ontario Government and 0.8% by the Federal Government.

Allowances

Condition Race Allowances: 2 year olds 50% on 2006 earnings; 3 year olds 25% on 2006 earnings and 50% on 2005 earnings; 4 year olds nil on 2006 earnings, 25% on 2005 earnings, nil on 2004 earnings; 5 year olds and up no allowance.

Claiming Race Allowances: 2-year-old fillies 100%; 2 year-old colts & geldings 75%; 3-year-old fillies 75%; 3-year-old colts & geldings 50%; 4-year-old mares 50%; 4-year-old horses & geldings 25%; 5-year-olds and older mares 25%; Spayed mares receive no allowance. In the case of a claimed horse, said horse need not necessarily increase its claiming price to be eligible to future claiming events.

Common Pool Wagering

Subject to the provisions of the Federal Regulations, in the unlikely event of a communications or computer systems failure, various courses of action may result depending on the nature of the breakdown. Bets from the affected sites, including advance bets, may be considered as a separate pool or may even be refunded in the event of a complete system failure. Changing a site's bets from common pool to separate pool may affect the odds and prices. Customers will be advised by public announcement of the course of action taken.

Rule 7.15

No association shall allow a person under 18 years of age to purchase or cash a ticket. For the purposes of this rule, a "ticket" is defined as a receipt or voucher that is issued by an association for one or more bets on a race or races. The association shall ensure that signs are clearly posted in all areas, or in application forms, where tickets are purchased or cashed, advising the public of the age restriction.

Federal Regulations Amendment

In the unlikely event that prices are posted which are based on an incorrect official order of finish, upon discovery and/or official notification of the error, associations must immediately stop paying the erroneous prices. The correct price will subsequently be calculated and paid, including a correction of all account-based wagers. This regulatory change reflects the existing standards in the United States.

For Your Attention

Although it is unlikely to occur, for bets that cannot be combined into a host track's pools before the end of a race, Federal Regulations require that such bets must be refunded. Refunding bets at some sites may affect odds and payouts at other locations.

HOW TO BOX AND WHEEL THE EXACTOR / TRIACTOR

Exactor "BOX" Tickets

The term "Box" is used when you place a wager on two or more horses in one race and wish to cover their every possible winning order of finish. Betting the "Box" is no more than making multiple wagers on one ticket. Example: If you were to "Box" three horses in a \$1 Exactor — let's use numbers 4, 5 and 8 as an example — the total cost would be \$6 because you are covering 6 possible exactor combinations at \$1 each. A \$2 Exactor Box of three horses would cost a total of \$12. In either case your combinations are 4-5, 5-4, 4-8, 8-4, 5-8 and 8-5. You would say to the mutuel teller: "\$___ Exactor Box 4-5-8."

Triactor "Box" Tickets

The same principle of the Exactor Box can be applied to the Triactor as well. Example: If you were to "Box" four horses in a \$1 Triactor — let's use numbers 2-3-6-8 as an example — the total cost would be \$24.00 because you are covering 24 possible Triactor combinations at \$1 each. A \$2 Triactor Box of four horses would cost a total of \$48. You would say to the mutuel teller: "\$___ Triactor Box 2-3-6-8."

HOW TO MAKE A BET

You don't have to bet to experience the thrill of picking a winner, but it does tend to increase your involvement. The choice is yours. Just read on if you'd like a little more information.



Some people pick their horses based on familiar names, lucky numbers, birthdates and just about any method that seems to work for them. This type of wagering can be fun — although it won't always produce a winner. Some people study the program's past performance information for hours on end, while others simply refer to the selections at the top of each page or the race analysis that is contained in many programs.

If you're new to the game, we suggest that you make a SHOW bet for your first play. The minimum bet is \$2 and you collect a payoff if your horse finishes first, second or third. When you're ready to place your bet, go to any mutuel window and say — "THE TRACK YOU WANT TO BET ON, eg Kawartha Downs, Two dollars to Show on number __, please".



At post time the horses will move into position behind the starting gate. The gate picks up speed until the starting point then pulls away and the race is on. You can follow your horse by the driver's colours or the saddle pad colour which is indicated in the program. After the race, wait until the finish is declared "OFFICIAL." If your horse finished first, second or third (and you made a Show bet) go to any mutuel window to collect your payoff.

THE BASIC BETS

WIN

When you bet a horse to win, you collect if your horse finishes first.

PLACE

When you bet a horse to place, you collect if your horse finishes first or second.

SHOW

When you bet a horse to show, you collect if your horse finishes first, second or third. You have the best chance of winning on a Show bet although the payoff is often the smallest.
